The Ness Wadia College of Commerce has a rich heritage of conducting activities for environmental protection and sustainability.

The College expands its efforts beyond the campus. Under the aegis of NCC and NSS, the college has conducted several programs such as Tree plantation drives, Heritage Conservation and Cleanliness, and workshops on Floral Biodiversity and Nursery Management. Under the University's flagship NSS river cleanliness drive – “My River, My Valentine”, the College has undertaken cleaning of several Ghats of the Mula and Mutha rivers in Pune City.

As a commitment towards environment protection, the college conducts Plantation Drives within the college. “Pruthvi”- is celebrated on 5th June every year to mark World Environment Day. This is a step forward towards creating awareness about pressing issues our planet is witnessing, and ways to address them. The activities of the college have gained traction. The outcome is evident from the number of students who have joined the Environment Association of the College in the last 3 years.

Another green initiative taken by the college is conducting Green Audit and Environment Audit.

Academic Year 2017-18

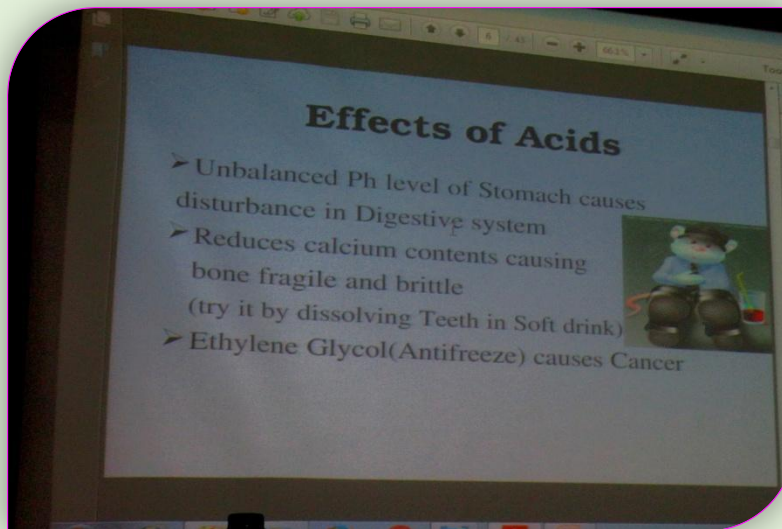

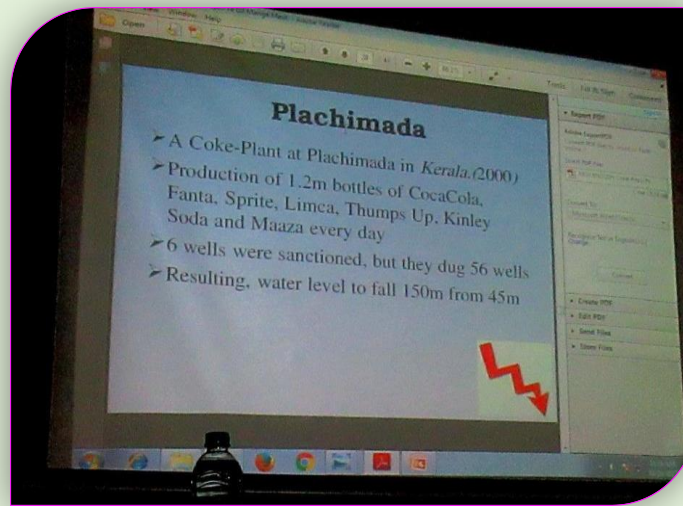


A still from the slide show showcasing adverse impact of Aerated Drinks on our health



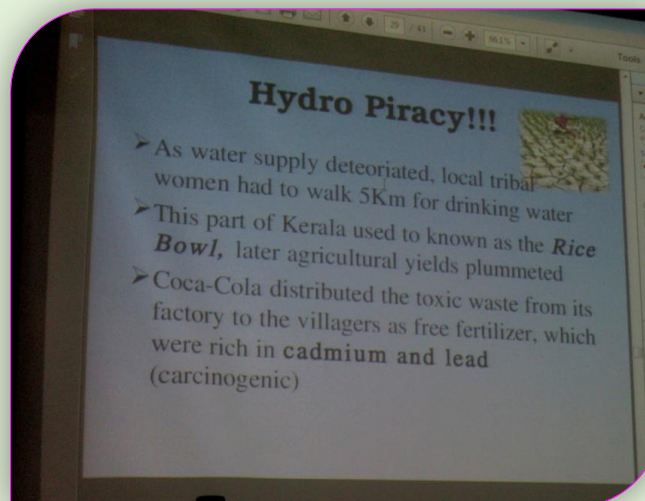

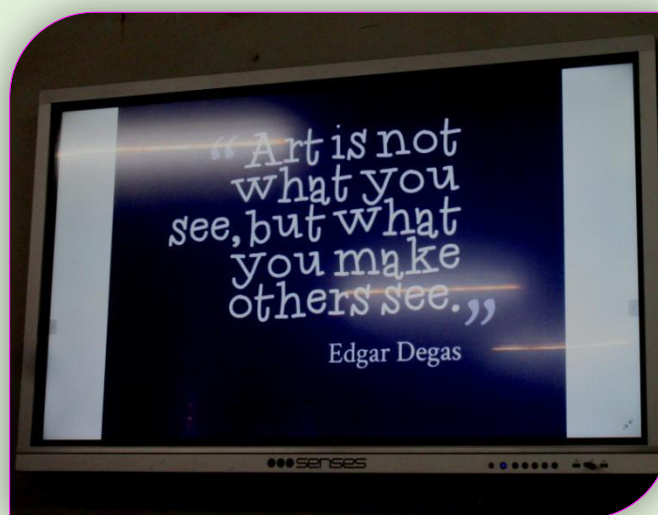

Kalpavruksha –A Saga of a Tree. This program was conducted on 26th Feb 2022 to create awareness about flora and their importance in urban landscapes.

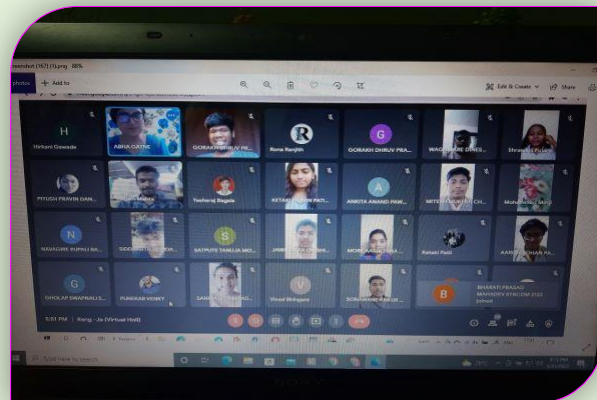
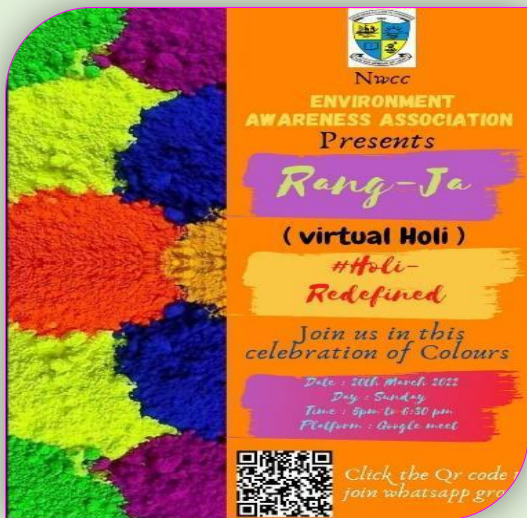

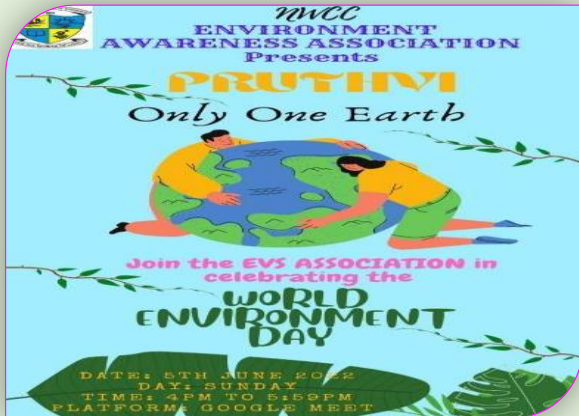

4. Beyond the Campus Environmental Promotion and Sustainability Activities

Academic Year 2017-18

A One Day Work shop on Introduction to the Floral Biodiversity of India & Nursery Management

`Trees` acquire utmost importance in the changing environmental conditions from sequestering carbon to providing food & fiber. Trees form an integral part of our day to day living.

To help our students appreciate the world of our green friends and understand ways of their propagation, a one day workshop was organized for our S.Y. B.Com EVS students in association with Pune Municipal Corporation at the Rajiv Gandhi Zoological Park & Research Centre on 14th September 2017.

In the introductory session of the workshop, a short documentary `Our Planet` was showcased which threw light on different ecosystems found on the earth. This helped students to understand them in a much better way.

In the First session, Ms. Ashwini Yadav, Education Officer at Pune Municipal Corporation introduced the students to the world of trees in her session on the `Floral Biodiversity of India`. She explained the different types of plants found in India, their botanical classification as terrestrial to aquatic and from parasitic to insectivores to those found in dry land along with their special characteristics and utility through a colorful slide show. She also explained the ecological importance of these trees along with the threats caused to them. Ms. Ashvini Yadav also explained steps taken for their conservation. This session helped the students get a better insight into the world of trees.



This was followed by the second session in which `Tree Walk` was organized for students. This session was conducted by Mr. Umesh Awasarkar from Biodiversity Board of Maharashtra. During this session students were taken around the campus of Zoological Park and were introduced to the different trees found on the campus. They were briefed about their special characteristics.

The third session was on `Nursery Management`. Students were taken to the Nursery section of the Park where Mr. Ganesh Shinde conducted the session. Here, students were explained the role and objectives of setting up a nursery.

In the concluding session of the workshop, students were presented with certificates from Pune Municipal Corporation for having successfully completed the workshop.

This workshop proved instrumental in not only making students understand the world of plants around us but also helped them in introducing students to becoming green entrepreneurs through nursery management.

Academic Year 2018-19

Workshop on honey bee keeping

As a part of the Golden Jubilee Activity, a Three day workshop was organized on Honey Bee Keeping. This activity was jointly organized by the Department of EVS & the Department of Business Administration in association with Khadi Gram Udyog and Central Bee Research & Training Institute (CBRTI) on 6th,7th & 8th February 2019. This workshop paved a way towards developing oneself as a 'Green Entrepreneur'. It was organized for students of S.Y. & T.Y. B.Com.

Day 1: 6th Feb 2019 (Resource Person – Dr. Daisy Thomas)

The inauguration was done by Dr. Thomas CBRTI. In her speech, the resource person said, 'Bees are an important element in nature. If these insects vanish, it will erode all our food thus leading to extinction of humans from earth'.

This was followed by the 1st session which was 'Introduction to different types of bees'. In this session, students were acquainted with different types of bees found in India and their characteristic features which are used in commercial as well as domestic beekeeping. In this session, students were also explained the hierarchy in bee colonies, different types of members of bee colonies and their importance.

In the 2nd session of the day, students were explained about site selection for beekeeping and the type of flora required for successful beekeeping.

She explained the importance of bees in pollination and also cited the case studies where beekeeping led to increase in agricultural productivity.

On day 1, students understood the importance of bees, their types, species and the kind of flora required to start bee keeping.

Days 2: 7th Feb 2019 (Resource Person – Dr. Wakode)

The first session of the day started with the screening of a documentary on 'Role of Khadi Village Industries Commission (KVIC) in honey bee keeping'. The documentary highlighted how beekeeping in tribal areas of Melghat & Wardha led to income generation and improved the quality of life along with helping the agricultural department to increase their forest yield.

The next session was on the scientific non destructive method of honey extraction developed by Central Bee Research Institute and other products of commercial importance obtained from bees like bee wax, royal jelly etc.

On Day two of the workshop, students learnt about the scientific method of honey extraction & other products obtained from bees.

Day 3: Visit to Central Bee research & Training institute.

On the third day, a visit was organized for all participants to CBRTI.

In the 1st session, the students were briefed by Mr. Pokhare, Training Coordinator who briefed the students about the organization, its establishment & various activities undertaken by the institute. This was followed by a screening of a documentary on beekeeping.

The 2nd session of the day was the visit to CBRTI museum where students were shown and explained the beekeeping methods, their evolution, different products obtained from bees and various equipment used for extraction of honey & beekeeping.

This was followed by the last session which was a practical demonstration in bee keeping and handling. Students were briefed about precautionary measures that need to be taken while handling bees, all of the above sessions were highly appreciated by students.

Academic Year 2019-20

NSS students participated in Flood relief camp at Sangli, Maharashtra

Due to heavy rainfall and flood-prone conditions, life in most parts of Kolhapur and Sangli was disrupted and destroyed in 2019. With this backdrop, rehabilitation and disaster management work was carried out with the cooperation of 1000 students and 25 professors across colleges between 22nd and 28th August 2019. One professor and five students from Ness Wadia College participated in the camp. The students cleaned the schools, the river ghats and premises, asked the local people about their losses and helped them accordingly. They also inquired about concessions and help they received from the government. It was moving to hear from locals teary eyed when they shared about their experiences.





River Cleaning Drive (October 2, 2019)

On the occasion of Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary and the golden jubilee year of the National Service Scheme, a river cleaning campaign was conducted on October 2. The program was managed by the district coordinator Dr. Rathod Sir.

This campaign was carried out in a chain mode on Mula and Mutha river. 10000 NSS volunteers from a total of 200 colleges in Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad cities participated.
