





WASTE PAPER RECYCLING PROJECT



WORKSHOP ON HONEY BEEE KEEPING

As a part of Golden Jubilee Activity a Three days workshop was organized on Honey Bee Keeping this activity was jointly organized by Dept. of EVS & Dept.of Business Administration in association with Khadi Gram Udyog and Central Bee Research & Training Institute on 6th,7th & 8th February 2019. This workshop paved a way towards developing oneself as a 'Green Enterprenuer'

A three days training program on bee keeping was organized for students of S.Y. & T.Y.B.Com. on 6^{th} , 7^{th} & 8^{th} February 2019.

This was jointly organized by the Dept. of EVS & Dept. of Business Administration in association with central bee research & training institute Pune.

Day 1: 6th Feb 2019 (Resource Person – Dr .Daisy Thomas)

The inauguration was done by Dr. Thomas CBRTI. She said in her speech that bee are important element in nature, these insects if they vanish, will erode all are food thus letting to extinction of humans from earth.

This was followed by 1st session which was `Introduction to different types of bees' in this students were acquainted with different types of bees found in India their characteristic features which are used in commercial as well as domestic bee keeping .in this session students were also explained about the hierarchy in bee colonies, different types of members of bee colonies & their importance.

In the 2nd session of the day students were explained about site selection for bee keeping & the type of flora required around for successful bee keeping.

She explained about importance of bees in pollination and alsocited the case studies whre bee keeping led to increase in agricultural productivity.

Thus on first day students understood the importance of bees ,their types, species and the kind of flora required to start bee keeping.

Days 2: 7th Feb 2019 (Resource Person – Dr. Wakode)

The first session of the day started with the screening of a documentary on `Role of Khadi Village Industries Commission (KVIC) in honey bee keeping ' the above documentary highlighted that how bee keeping in tribal areas of Melghat & Wardha led to income generation and improved the quality of life along with helping agricultural department to increase their forest yield.

The next session was on scientific non destructive method of Honey extraction developed by Central bee research institute & other products of commercial importance obtained from bees like bee wax, royal jelly etc.

In the First session Ms.Ashwini Yadav Educational officer at Pune Municipal Corporation introduced the students to the world of trees in her session on the `Floral Biodiversity of India` she explained about different type of plants found in India-their botanical classification as terrestrial to aquatic and from parasitic to insectivores to those found in dry land along with their special characteristics and utility through a colorful slide show. She also explained about the ecological importance of these trees along with the threats caused to them & steps taken for their conservation. This session helped the students get a better insight into the world of trees.

This session was followed by the second session in which `Tree Walk` was organized for students .this session was conducted by Mr. Umesh Awasarkar from Biodiversity Board of Maharashtra ,during this session students were taken around the campus of Zoological Park and were introduced to the different trees found on the campus and were explained about their special characteristics.

The third session was on `Nursery Management` students were taken to the Nursery section of the Park where Mr.Ganesh Shinde conducted the above session. Here students were first explained about the role and objectives of setting up of nursery.






A still from the slide show showcasing adverse health impacts of Cola Drinks.




